
## **History and Current Situation**

### **NEC Resolution: Temporary Cap**


 NEC resolution temporarily caps the defence fund to address operating budget shortfalls





## **NEC Resolution: Temporary Cap**

 Defence fund reverts to its original terms once new revenue sources are found.






#### Members' Resolution: Grow the Defence Fund

- Requires plan to replenish and hold a debate on the defence fund
- How could replenishment happen?
  - Contribute 75% of operating surplus to the defence fund (Used by CAPE)
  - Allocate a portion of all dues to the defence fund (Used by CUPE, CUPW, UFCW, Unifor, etc.)
  - Create a conditional levy where members contribute if the defence fund drops below a set level (Used by PSAC)



# Share of operating surplus – CAPE

- 75% of any surplus is placed in the defence fund.
- Considerations
  - No additional levy
  - Funding less predictable
  - No options for accelerated replenishment






## Share of dues: Case Study- Unifor

**Unifor Dues Structure** 

- Every dollar of dues are divided between Unifor's various funds, including the Defence Fund
- Considerations
  - Regular contributions to the fund
  - Plan for accelerated replenishment
  - Could require a higher dues increase
  - Requires constitutional change






## Special levy – Case Study: PSAC

- Members pay \$1 per month into the Strike Fund in addition to national and component dues
- Considerations
  - Regular contributions to the fund
  - Levy only paid when the strike fund drops below a set threshold (\$25M for PSAC)
  - Requires constitutional change

PSAC Dues Structure (% of salary)

- National Dues 0.9557%
- Component Dues 0.52559% to 1.188497%
- \$1 per month for Strike Fund





#### Options for implementing both resolutions

- CAPE will present options for replenishment to the NEC as required in the members' resolution.
- NEC can propose a path forward (e.g., returning to surplus, allocating a share of dues, special levy, etc.)
- Without action, the defence fund reverts to its original terms when the operating deficit is addressed.
